

On March 1st you'll be seeing orange.

On March 1st, principals will paste a four-inch orange square to everything that will be affected by the May 8th sinking fund proposal.

If a door will be replaced, it will have an orange square attached to it. If a piece of furniture will be replaced, it will be marked with an orange square. And, if a window or piece of technology will be replaced or upgraded, you'll see an orange square affixed to it.

"The idea," said Superintendent Alan Latosz, "is to help people visualize what will happen if voters approve the May 8th sinking fund proposal. Too often residents of a community cannot 'see' how a sinking fund proposal will affect students and the community. The orange squares will help them."

"While it's difficult to put an orange square on sinking fund projects that are behind walls, under floors, on the roof, or outside, we'll be doing our best to mark everything in orange." he said.

Latosz said he wants to have the orange squares up so people attending various school functions and community events can see the impact of the sinking fund proposal. "More people seeing the orange squares means that more people will understand the scope of the sinking fund proposal," he added

There will also be an easel in the lobby of all schools that lists the sinking fund proposal projects.
