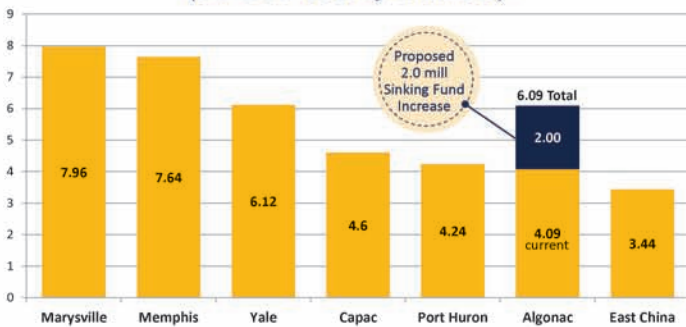


## POINTE TREMBLE

### May 2, 2017 Ballot

On the May 2, 2017 ballot, voters in Algonac Community Schools will be asked to consider a 2-mill Building and Site Sinking Fund (BSSF) that would generate approximately \$1.2 million annually for the next 10 years to fund ongoing facility and technology needs and repairs in our district buildings.

### Economic Advantages SINKING FUND

- Money is collected locally, stays local and does not go through Lansing.
- There are no interest or debt payments.
- Projects funded on a pay-as-you-go basis.
- An independent audit of the use of sinking fund dollars is conducted annually, as required by the Michigan Department of Treasury.
